The clinic was the first federally-recognized community health center in the the state of Missouri. 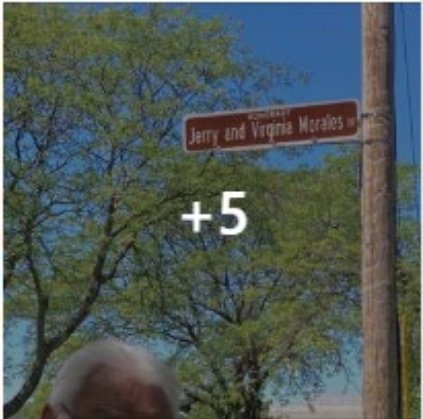
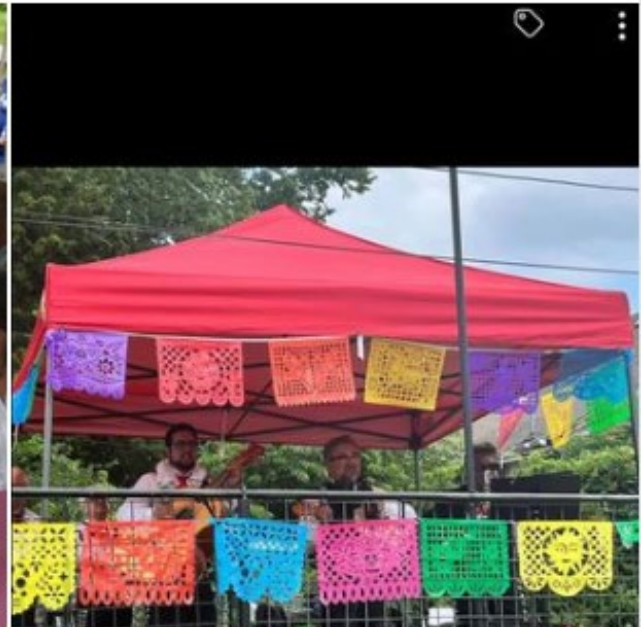

KEY MOMENTS IN U.S. GAY RIGHTS MOVEMENT

The modern gay rights movement began 50 years ago in New York City's Stonewall Inn when patrons of the gay bar fought back during a police raid and ignited a widespread protest for equal rights and acceptance for gays, lesbians, bisexuals and transgender people.

June 27, 1969 Patrons of a New York City gay bar fight back for the first time during police raid; provokes days of rioting

1984 Berkeley, Calif., becomes first city to offer its employees domestic-partnership benefits.

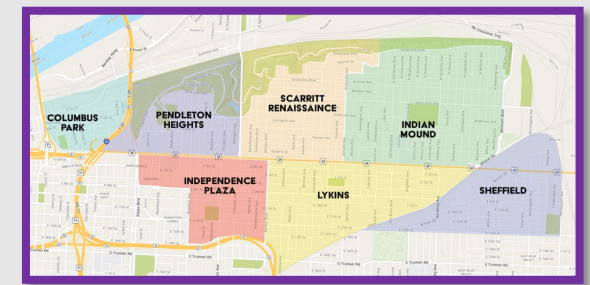


THE GARRISON FIELD HOUSE

The Garrison Field House, now Community Center, was designed by Benjamin Lubsczch, an architect with Adriance Van Brunt and Company. When completed in 1914 for more than \$55,000, the field house included an administrative office, gymnasium, auditorium with stage, two club rooms, a branch library, and a public bath with forty-one showers for men and women. Garrison Square, which began as a playground for a local school, was designed exclusively for the black community and was named for William Lloyd Garrison, the noted abolitionist and journalist. Along with the field house the Square contained playground equipment, baseball diamond, and wading pool. The park remains the best example of a small park or "square" for active recreation facilities in pleasant surroundings, which was an integral part of George E. Keaster's philosophy as he stated in the 1893 Report of the Board of Park and Boulevard Commissioners of Kansas City, Missouri.

Independence Avenue CID Street Ambassador Spotlight : Kenny McKinzy

The Independence Avenue Community Improvement District (CID) oversees improvements along Independence Avenue. These improvements include trash collection, beautification, and assistance in a program referred to as GRIME, CRIME & CHIME. The CID's crew of 10 Urban Street Ambassadors includes Kenny McKinzy, who has been a familiar face on the avenue for the past 11 years.

Over the years, McKinzy has helped with mowing, planting, and trash collection — but has been solely handling the collection of items placed in the Avenue's recycling receptacles since the CID began a recycling program in 2018. Now on a part-time schedule, he empties receptacles in all four zones three times a week.

McKinzy said the challenging part of his duties are getting people to put the right items in the recycling containers, especially within Zone 2. "Somebody put their used motor oil in there, and it spilled all over me when I emptied it," he said. "When that happens, nothing in there can be recycled, it all has to go in the trash."

McKinzy has noticed a great improvement in the appearance of the Avenue since he began working as an Ambassador. "It was an uphill battle back then. It looks so much better now," he said.
