

Independence Ave Overlay Ordinance (ICO)

Special character overlay specifically designed for the Avenue: Chapter 88, Code of Ordinances of the City of Kansas City, Missouri, commonly known as the Zoning and Development Code, is hereby amended by enacting a new section to be known as Section 88-20A1057, rezoning by creating a Special Character Overlay District.

Purpose. This overlay aims to promote design excellence and walkability for all parcels on the Independence Corridor from Forest Avenue on the west to Ewing A venue on the east, and all parcels two blocks south of Independence Boulevard on Paseo Boulevard, and two blocks south of Independence Boulevard on Prospect Avenue (see Map).

COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR ORDINANCE NO. 1605

- i. The standards of this article apply to all development in the Independence Overlay District. This document establishes the development standards that vary from the underlying base zoning for the properties in the Independence Overlay District. All provisions described below as regulatory in nature have the same force and effect as, but are variations from, the standards set forth in Chapter 88 - Zoning and Development Code.
- ii. If provisions of this overlay district are inconsistent with Chap

 88, the provisions of this overlay district shall apply
- If provisions of this overlay district are inconsistent with a Historic Overlay District then the provisions of the Historic Overlay District shall apply.
- iv. MPD and UR districts are exempt from the standards of this ordinance; however, standards in this ordinance shall be used to guide the development of standards for MPD and UR districts.
- v. Other than as set forth below, the underlying zoning and the regulations and standards included in the Zoning and Development Code, Chapter 88, prescribed for the areas rezoned to this overlay district shall remain unchanged and shall continue to apply.
- 1. New Development. Full compliance with this article
- Enlargements and Expansions. Full compliance with the article applies only to the enlargement or expansion area.
- Façade Changes. Compliance with this article applies to façade changes to existing buildings.
- Change of Use or Occupancy. Compliance with standards apply whenever the use or occupancy of property changes.
- Signage. Compliance with signage standards apply when a sign permit is required.
- vi. The standards of this article apply to Areas A, B, and C (see Attachment A) as noted in each standards heading.


